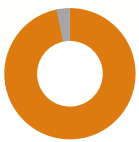


Homelessness Fact Sheet

On the night of the 2021 Census, there were 13,104 people experiencing homelessness in the Northern Territory.

12X The Northern Territory has 12 times the national rate of homelessness.



87% of all homeless people in the NT were First Nations people.



76% of all homeless people in the NT were living in severely overcrowded conditions.



53% of people who reached out for homelessness support were experiencing Family and Domestic Violence.

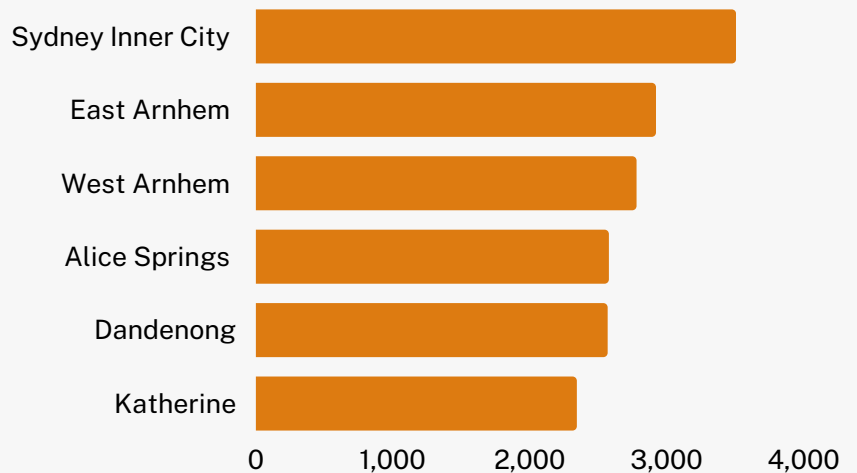


6% of the Northern Territory's population was homeless on census night.

2,748 2,748 were children under 12 years of age. That's **21%** of the homeless population.

6,978 There were 6,978 requests for help that were unable to be met.

Four of the top six highest geographical areas of homelessness in Australia are in the Northern Territory.



On any given day in the NT...

320 young people present alone to access homelessness help.

25 Requests for assistance from homelessness services are unable to be met.

185 Clients are sleeping in emergency accommodation.

10 New clients reach out for support from a homelessness service for their first time.
